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History:

The Government of Maharashtra has sanctioned College of Agriculture, Karad, on the occasion of celebration of birth centenary year of Late Hon. Shri. Yashwantrao Chavan, Former Deputy Prime Minister of India and Former Chief Minister of Maharashtra, as per Resolution No. MKV 2011 / Pra.kra.80 / 7 A Dated: 16/07/2013 and Mahatma Phule Krishi Vidyapeeth University Resolution No. MTG-2(191)/107/2013, Dated: 03.09.2013.

The College is situated at 17.17⁰ Latitude and 74.17⁰ Longitude with 618 m ht. from mean sea level. The College is well connected with Pune-Bangalore National highway, Chiplun-Vijapur State highway and airport facility. The College office buildings and instructional farm is about 4 km away from main Karad city.

The College has newly established Administrative building, Library, Boys' and Girls' hostels, Students Amenity Complex, Play ground and Instructional Farm. The first batch of students from this College has successfully completed B. Sc (Agri.) degree programme during 2016-17.

Mandate:

The College of Agriculture, Karad is a unique campus under the Mahatma Phule Krishi Vidyapeeth, Rahuri, with complete integration of all the three functions *viz.*; teaching, research and extension. The major mandates of the college are:

- i) Making provision for imparting education in Agriculture.
- ii) Advancement of learning and conducting research particularly in Agriculture and other allied sciences / technologies especially for the rural people of the state in general.
- iii) Undertaking activities pertaining to major mandates *viz*, education, research and extension as directed by the University time to time.

Medical Facilities:

At college medical clinic facility is available. In case of emergency the vehicle from college is provided so that the patient can be taken to nearby hospital. The medical checkup of students admitted to various degree courses in first year is conducted and health record is maintained. In emergency cases the patient is referred to Civil /Super Specialty hospital. In addition to this General Health Check up camp, Eye check up camp, Hemoglobin check up camp and blood donation camp are organized regularly in the college.

Final year students of the College are imparted Experiential Learning/ Students Ready Programme with their subject of interest from the various departments. The students are required to work in the lab as well as field on full time basis to understand the need of the industry and farmers and acquire the latest practical knowledge pertinent to his topic of interest. The students are exposed to the latest information to develop their intellectually by organizing the lectures by the national / international experts in the respective fields. Field visit/ industrial visit and tour are also organized by the college from time to time to make them aware of the latest trends in the market. Students are also encouraged to participate in the national / international seminars and conference to interact with the experts in the respective fields. Over the years, the college will mark influence in the area and set up its own standard to attract the students of high quality education.

Placement:

This College organizes various innovative and informative trainings lectures by the experts in Employability, Personality Development, Stress Management, Time Management, Yoga exercise, Entrepreneurship, Skill Development, etc. The students' visits are arranged to various Industries, Banks, Dairies and Implement Manufacturers for their skill development through interactive and hands-on experience. It enhances their confidence level to make them employable.

Similarly, the passed out students who are engaged in Research, Public Services, Government Services, Banks, Private sector are invited to interact with the students on Saturday and Sunday through Placement and Competitive cell, NSS regularly.

NSS Unit:

As a step to introduce the concept of responsibility, discipline and self sufficiency, the College organizes the NSS activities. Students voluntarily register and participate in the trainings, camps organized from time to time. The 50 students (Boys' and Girls') enroll every year attend the Special Camp every year.

The Department of Youth Affairs and Sports in the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India, sponsors the National Service Scheme Programme. The National Service Scheme (NSS) was started in 2015-16. The students of second and third year enroll for NSS. The strength of NSS unit is however, decided by the University Advisory Committee for NSS, which is working under the Chairmanship of Hon. Vice Chancellor.

NSS activities comprises of two heads *viz.*, Regular NSS activities and NSS special campaign programme *viz.*, *Swacha* Bharat Clean Campaign, Plastic Free Campaign. The various programmes such as blood donation, tree plantation, prevention of AIDS, adult educations etc. are organized as special campaigns.

Personality Development:

Special lectures are arranged on personality development of students by inviting experts in various fields like Professional in Agriculture, Stress management, Banking, Languages, Entrepreneurs, Spiritual, Yoga, Actors, Doctors, for personality development of students. Celebration of Birth and Death anniversaries of various National Leaders and informing their social works to the student so that they can take lesson from the life story of National leaders.

There is a facility of small recreational hall where expert lectures and small functions are arranged. The college is having a recreational hall for Annual day for celebration of various multicultural programmes. All these encourage positive interaction, academic persistence and growth among student's faculty and staff.

Auditorium/Examination Hall:

Central examination hall cum auditorium facility well equipped with CCT, sound system, LCD projector Screen is available with College of Agriculture, Karad. The hall accommodates around 500 audiences. This hall is used for college functions like annual prize distribution programme, annual variety entertainment programme, and various extra–curricular activities of students like orientation programme, teacher–parents meets, agricultural education day celebration, blood donation camp, eye check up camp, elocution competition, guest lectures, television agricultural programme, etc.
